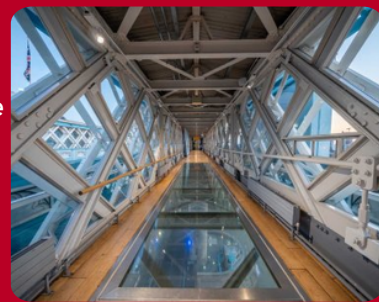




MUSEUMS

Tower Bridge Experience

Tate Modern

Tower of London

This historic castle and world heritage site displays an in-depth history and cultural significance of the crown jewels, along with a range of Royal Ceremonial Dresses, recently updated in 2024. A minimum of a 3 hour visit is recommended to see all of the sights of the Tower of London; the crown jewels, the ravens, meet the Yeoman Warders as well as the tower itself. London Zoo is one of the oldest in the world after being founded in 1826 by the Zoological Society of London, which was originally built to keep animals for scientific research. It is now home to over 20,000 animals from 698 different species, spread over 36 acres of Regents Park. One of the highlights of the zoo is the penguin beach, which features England's largest penguin pool where visitors can watch feeding times twice a day. The zoo is involved with global wildlife conservation charities and aims to reverse wildlife decline and restore the diversity of life everywhere. The market started over 1000 years ago at the foot of London Bridge, yet has been in the current location since 1756 and is run by a charitable trust on behalf of the community. Over 100 stalls offer a dazzling variety of British and international flavours all with an exceptional level of knowledge and expertise. The market is split into 3 areas; Crown Square (larger producers and merchants), Green Market (small, specialist produce traders) and Borough Market Kitchen (street food traders), so there is sure to be something for everyone's tastebuds!
